### Beyond jaguars and maned-wolves. Training is back, and with them, more registers of the wildlife!

With the monitoring training back at Legado das Águas, Atlantic Forest, we started receiving more moments spotted by our intern team at the reservation.

This time, one employee captured a common sloth crossing the road, all soaky, after a rainy day.

Sloths are mammals, relatives to giant anteaters and brazilian armadillos and can be found in wet forests in Brazil and other countries in South and Central Americas. They feed on leaves and fruits and spend most of their time in the treetops resting.

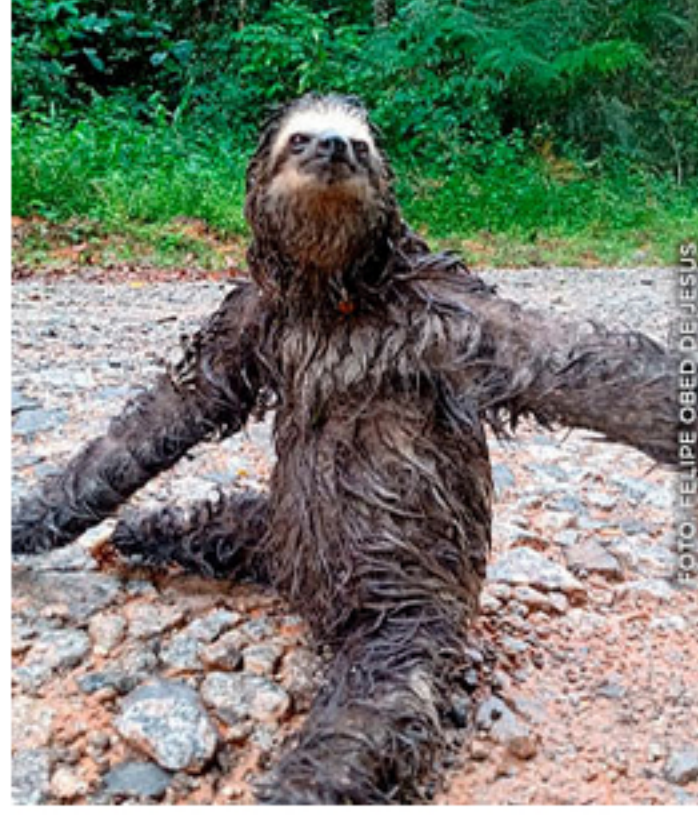

Understand how the introduction of animals back in the nature works.

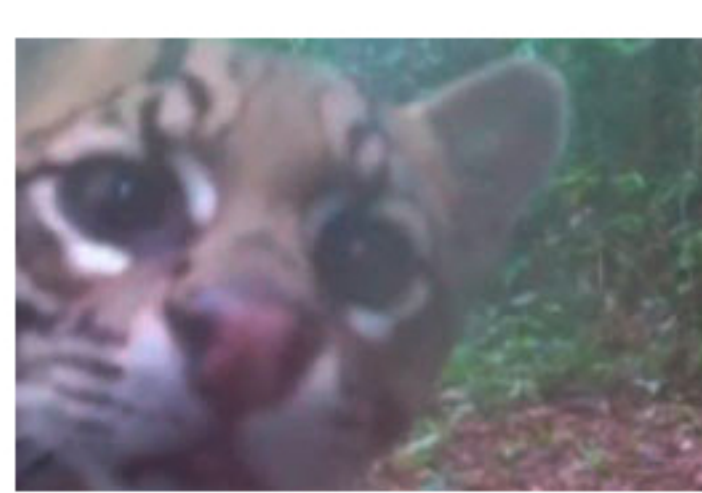

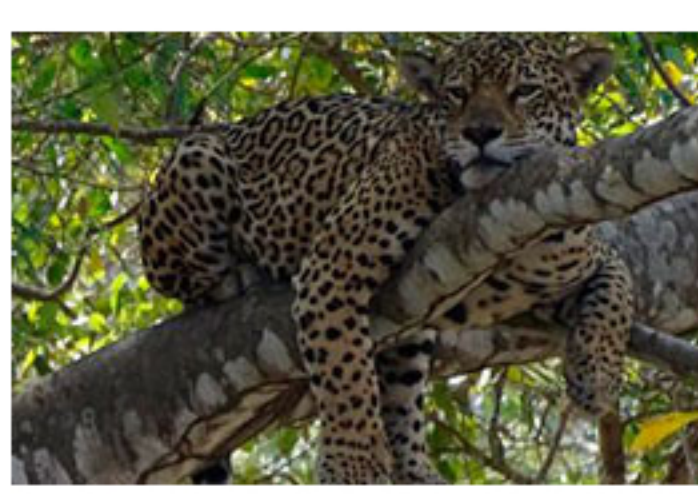
