In March we celebrate International Women's Day and I'd like to congratulate and thank all women, especially those working for team Onçafari.

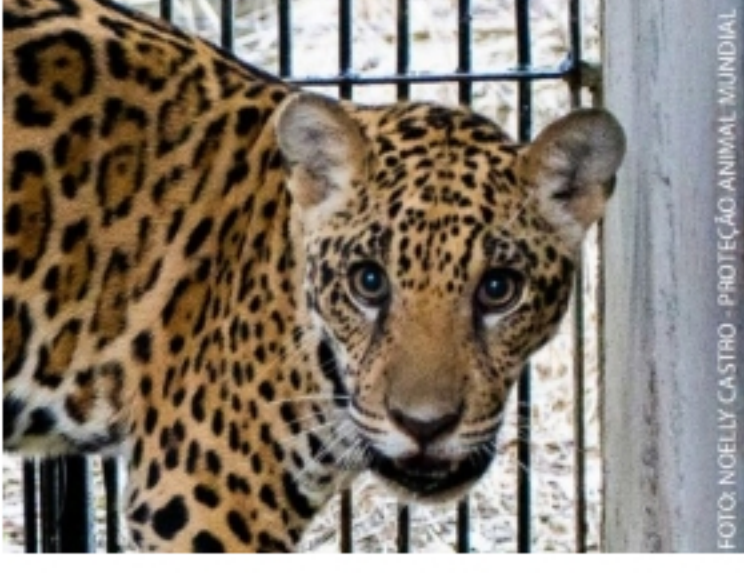
Through the years, Onçafari grew and, nowadays, 40% of the team is represented by women, working in administration, marketing and in the field.

Pantanal was elected one of the 50 greatest destinations in the world to visit in 2023 by the North American magazine Time.
